

## RAJASTHAN HOUSING BOARD: JAIPUR

### CIRCULAR

During site visits of various construction projects at Jaipur and other stations, it has been observed that no specific PLANTATION was planned for row housing as well as Multi-storey Premises. In some places, though flats were ready for possession, no plant was seen in the premises. This reflects very poor state of affairs. In view of this, the following directions are issued with immediate effect :-

1. In future, plantation of the area shall be planned in advance and will be done simultaneously with the construction activity. Plantation for premises of already constructed building should also be taken up.
2. The row housing shall have at least 1.00 mtr. Wide soft strip (earth portion) for plantation of large trees abutting boundary lines on both sides. The list of suitable trees with description is enclosed as Annexure-'A'.
3. For Multi-storey Premises a minimum of 1.00 mtr. Strip must be kept reserved for large trees plantation abutting boundary wall inside the premises. Trees shall be placed at every 6.00 mtr. Distance linearly. The 1.00 mtr. Strip beneath large trees shall be covered with ground cover plants after trees crossed six feet height. The rest of the green area can be treated with shrubs and ground cover with occasional trees as per the landscape design. Lists of the shrubs and ground cover have been enclosed as Annexure-'B'.
4. Other large open areas of the premises can also be used for increasing greenery by grass pavers etc. The road dividers (Median portion) may also be used for planting flowering trees and shrubs.

PLANTATION

All concerned are directed to follow the above guidelines strictly, otherwise they will be liable for strict disciplinary action.
